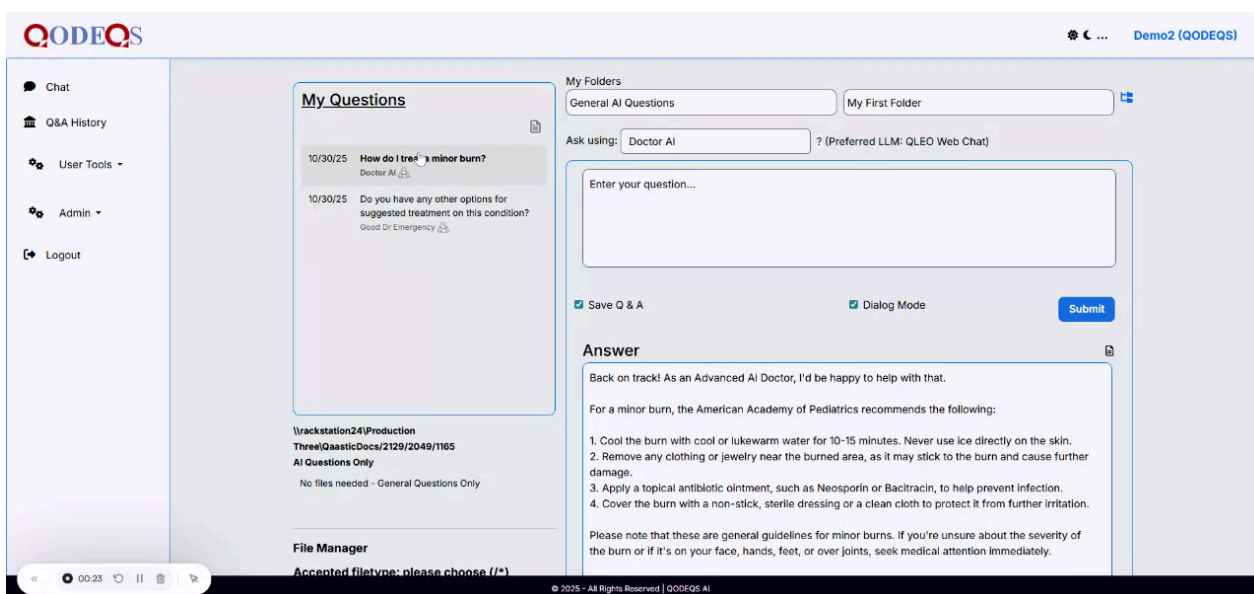


Navigating and Editing Model Responses

Step 1


